


Teamwork



Background

- Teamwork
 - "No one alone is sufficiently wise" Plautus
 - It is more than a collection of individuals working in the same room
 - It is a coordination of effort to achieve a common goal



What is Teamwork?

- More than a collection of individuals working together

- The final product is a high performance team with collective accountability
- "Team" is ultimately responsible for patient outcomes

 - ABCDE sequentially




